South Branch library renovation and Defiance City Schools

> South Branch library continued

The backstory

ProMedica obtained the building from the Lucas County Land Bank. The project is a collaboration among ProMedica, Compassion Health Toledo, the credit union, and neighborhood revitalization organization Historic South.

The original South Toledo library branch opened in 1918 at Broadway and Langdon. The building construction was funded by Andrew Carnegie. The library moved to its current Broadway Street location in 2004.

Defiance City Schools - GEM has joined RLI on site to perform steel erection and technology work for the new middle/high school.

RLI is construction manager for the twostory, 231,000-square-foot building that will serve over 1,300 students.

The middle/high school construction is expected to be complete in late 2017.

Demo of the existing high school, located directly in front of the new school, will start in early 2018 with the final site package wrapping up in summer 2018.
