NEW PROJECTS GEM Energy's CHP project for Corning and RLI's new Mercy Health facility

Corning, Big Flats, NY - GEM Energy is designing and installing a natural gas-fueled combined heat and power (CHP) system at Corning Incorporated's Innovation Support Center.

The project will expand Corning's utility capacity to power new research and development processes.

Equipped with a Capstone C1000S microturbine power package, the 1-megawatt CHP system will generate:

- over 8.6 million kWh of electricity.
- 9 million kWh of hot water heating to support the new R&D processes.

The project is scheduled for commissioning in July.

Mercy Health, Perrysburg – Construction starts this summer on a 101,000-square-foot hospital, surgery center and medical office building.

RLI is construction manager and will self-perform site work, concrete, masonry and carpentry on the three-story facility, which will connect to the adjacent cancer center.

The new hospital will offer 28 inpatient beds in addition to the 18-bed inpatient area on the third floor of the cancer center.

The third-floor cancer center build-out starts in July. The entire project is scheduled for completion in spring 2019.
