Ann Arbor RR vehicle logistics facility and BASF

Ann Arbor Railroad Distribution Facility, Toledo - RLI and GEM are working on Phase 1 development for a new vehicle logistics facility on the 71-acre former Raceway Park site.

The project includes nearly two miles of perimeter fencing and guardrail, lighting, cameras, tree clearing, and site demo.

RLI is design/build contractor and is

self-performing sitework, concrete, demo and waterline work. GEM is performing electrical work. Phase 1 completes in late October.



Ohio Air National Guard 180th Fighter Wing, Swanton - A 15th Anniversary Remembrance Ceremony on September 11 showcased the 9/11 sundial memorial created by RLI and other local contractors.

RLI craftspeople have completed the concrete work within the circle, including custom-dyed concrete and a unique, etched clock face. The RLI team also placed the flagpole.

Every year, at 8:46 a.m. on September 11, the flagpole will cast a shadow across the same numerals on the clockface - marking the time when the first plane struck the World Trade Center.

"That took some engineering and precise coordination by our crews," says **Brian Seeger**, general manager of RLI Special Accounts.

RLI donated a portion of labor costs to help make the monument a reality.

BASF addition and Tata Steel line upgrades

BASF, Monaca, Penn. - GEM is working on an addition to house a PE vessel. The 300-square-foot addition will be constructed on top of an existing structure.

The project includes modifying the existing structure and adding structural components to provide an anchor point for the vessel.

The addition starts about 70 feet above ground elevation and rises another 20 feet. A monorail lifting system will be installed inside the addition.

The crew will work from scaffolds and man lifts, and will perform tasks around ongoing BASF operations. Work will be

complete in December.

Tata Steel, Warren - GEM and RLI are working on upgrades for the nickel zinc coating line.

The design/build project involves raising the roof in two areas, using a Varco-Pruden building system. RLI will perform floor demo, repairs and foundations. GEM will install new equipment at the entry and exit of the existing line. Work is scheduled for completion in March 2017.

Engineers (TRACE), the entire project will be complete by September 2017.

A SUCCESSFUL 'SCRAMBLE' FOR UT'S GATEWAY PROJECT

Our associates' swift response and flexibility came into play when The University of Toledo requested modifications for the Gateway sign and limestone piers on Secor Road.

The project involved raising the piers about two feet and inserting keyways to match the other entrances at UT so a new sign could be placed.

RLI masons worked two weekends to

complete the work.
