NEW PROJECTS: DTE ENERGY SHUTDOWN, PCS NUTRIEN RIVER WATER SYSTEM AND CLEVELAND CLIFFS

Monroe, MI - Unit 1 at DTE's Monroe Power Plant will be undergoing an outage for necessary maintenance and repairs. GEM will perform work on the suspended boiler.

Inside the 150-foot-tall boiler, the team will replace 4,300 square-feet of waterwall, 53 secondary superheat inlet pendants and 322 roof tubes.

The project must be well-orchestrated since a majority of the work will be rigged or suspended from the facility.

Along with boilermakers, the project will require the work of pipefitters, electricians, ironworkers, laborers and operating engineers.

Work will begin in September and will be complete within 72 days.
