

RLI'S RECORD-BREAKING CONTINUOUS CONCRETE POUR AT CLEVELAND-CLIFFS



Toledo - On Aug. 22, RLI completed our biggest-ever continuous concrete pour at the Cleveland-Cliffs IronUnits \$700 million hot-briquetted iron (HBI) facility.

Details on the 12-hour pour:

- The 9-foot-thick furnace mat foundation required 4,907 cubic yards of concrete and 484 tons of rebar.
- The pour required 16 laborers, eight cement finishers, two concrete pumps, two concrete conveyors and 49 ready-mix concrete trucks.
- The multiple batch plants delivered concrete at more than the 400 cubic yards per hour requested. Sensors were installed to monitor differential temperatures due to the mass concrete requirements.

The foundation will support a 400-foot-tall furnace used to make iron for local steel mills. The plant will produce 1.6 million metric tons of HBI per year.

WALGREENS WAREHOUSE EXPANSION IS UNDERWAY

Perrysburg – RLI and GEM are working on Walgreens' 395,000-square-foot expansion, which includes new warehouse, shipping and connector link buildings.

RLI is performing concrete, carpentry and tilt-up walls. GEM is handling structural steel erection, plumbing, HVAC, electrical and fire alarm work.

The expansion will increase the distribution center's size to 1.2 million square feet. Work will be complete in spring 2019.

GEM Facility Management recently secured contracts with these customers:


- Plymouth Industrial REIT, Inc. in Cleveland
