Two BASF jobs: dehumidification system and lithium ion battery installation

BASF, Beachwood – GEM is modifying existing laboratory space at BASF's R&D facility to allow for ultra-low humidity conditions.

The project includes lab casework modifications, utility connections and a new rooftop dehumidification air handling unit to provide an ultra-low humidity air supply to the renovated lab space.

GEM is managing the project and self-performing pipefitting, plumbing, electrical, insulation and ironwork.

All interior modifications will be completed while the lab is occupied. Work is scheduled for completion in late May.

ing the existing lithium ion battery (LIB) installation in Building 90 to handle new raw materials and additional equipment for producing lithium nickel oxide (LNO).

GEM is providing and installing all mechanical and electrical system modifications to the production line, including installing and setting BASF-provided equipment, instrumentation and devices.

RLI formed and poured the exterior oxygen equipment concrete pad for the new PraxAir oxygen storage system.

The project is scheduled for completion on April 30.


