- conveyor upgrades
- facility/tooling modifications
- miscellaneous civil projects

Whirlpool, Creek Plastics and Campbell Soup

Whirlpool, Clyde – **RLG** is working on plant modifications for a new plastics press.

RLI is demolishing an existing plastics press foundation and installing a new foundation for the press.

GEM is modifying process piping in a trench to accommodate the redesigned footing for the new plastics press.

Work will be done during a shutdown for the press while all other areas of the plant remain functional. The new press will be delivered in May.
