#### **KENWORTH UPDATE**

## A truckload of projects keeps the Rudolph Libbe team busy

**Chillicothe, Ohio** — Kenworth's goal is to build 200 trucks per day at its Chillicothe Assembly Plant in southern Ohio.

The RLG team stationed in Walbridge and at the plant are determined to help the longtime customer get there with 160 per day as the next milestone.

It recently completed eight new dock positions in two separate areas while the plant was operating. Construction has begun on a new chassis paint expansion that is expected to last well into 2025. These are just some of the 30-plus RLI-led projects that are in preconstruction or underway. There is a big push to get the work done by 2026 because Kenworth expects a big bump in business before new heavy duty truck emissions rules take effect in 2027.

Preconstruction Leader **Logan Wilson** said each completed project removes a production bottle neck that will move Kenworth closer to its goal. Future projects include installing a 15-ton overhead crane system and a new battery charging facility for Kenworth's soon-to-come electric line of trucks.

#### **LIMA'S SMALLER FAB SHOP PROMOTES EFFICIENCY**

Bigger isn't always better when it comes to getting the work done

**Lima, Ohio** — GEM Lima's new fabrication shop is an example of addition by subtraction.

GEM had been leasing a nearby building that was much larger. It also leaked so much that it confused welders performing hydrostatic testing because they couldn't determine the source of water. So when the opportunity to buy a former truck repair facility and convert it to a fab shop presented itself, GEM jumped at it.

After a great deal of planning and work, Lima now owns its fab shop, which is located a stone's throw from GEM Lima's new headquarters on Easton Circle. Pipefitter Shop Foreman **Terry Leppla** said the trade-off of less space for having a fab shop that GEM owns and has control over is a good one.

"Our old location was starting to fall into disrepair," Leppla said. "The pipefitters like the new shop. The layout is more open and organized, and it doesn't leak when it rains."

The reduction in space meant that

the fab shop needed to be better organized and more efficient. So they started from scratch to redesign the work flow and followed in the footsteps of the Walbridge fab shop by using the Japanese kaizen method to bring order and standardization to the welding stations.

"You are kind of forced to be efficient with less space," Leppla said.

Three new floor-mounted jib cranes were purchased and installed in the building. The building's exterior was painted to match GEM's blue brand color. A new exterior GEM sign also was installed.

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#### **NEW WORK**

Bowling Green, Ohio — RLI will build a 150,000-square-foot high school that utilizes geo-thermal heating and cooling.

The existing Bowling Green high school will be partially demolished, and the remaining structure will have a new entry and be renovated.

There will be site upgrades to support the new high school and middle school campuses.

Maple Heights, Ohio — GEM in Northeast Ohio will install an exhaust system for Liberty Ford so it can convert its body shop to a truck repair shop.

GEM will install more than 300 feet of rail systems with nine exhaust hoses and three fans to service nine truck repair bays.

Liberty Ford gave a broad idea of what it needed, and the GEM team fashioned a complete turnkey design and solution. Work begins in September and is expected to last about a month.

Warren, Ohio — RLG in Northeast Ohio is building a 119,000-square-foot manufacturing facility for Cleveland Steel Container Corp.

The project includes a Varco-Pruden preengineered metal building, plus adjacent office and storage space. The design-build project is expected to be completed by summer 2025.

**Ann Arbor, Michigan** — GEM Service in Michigan will replace the dielectrics of each variable air volume box at the Toyota Technical Center.

Challenges for the project include following Toyota's strict safety protocols.

The work is expected to be completed by late August or early September.

**Columbus** — GEM Service will perform HVAC work on a new wing of the Sarepta Therapeutics pharmaceutical research and development facility.

The work adds to the HVAC maintenance that GEM Service currently performs at the facility. Challenges include preventing downtime and working in clean rooms with HEPA filtration systems that require special attention.
